



TWO-HANDED (WINDLASS) TOURNIQUET APPLICATION

TACTICAL FIELD CARE (TFC)




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CONSIDER body substance isolation. NOTE: If a Combat Lifesaver is available, direct them to assist.

EXPOSE the injury and assess the bleeding source. **NOTE:** Clothing may need to be cut away to properly expose the injury.



APPLY direct pressure 02 to control bleeding.



REMOVE tourniquet 03 from the casualty's JFAK and/or carrying pouch.



NOTE: Reassess any tourniquet applied in Care Under Fire and,

if ineffective, tighten (if possible) and apply a second tourniquet

side-by-side with the first if bleeding is not controlled.

INSERT wounded 04 extremity through the loop of band (looped).

ROUTE band around limb, and through routing buckle.



POSITION 2-3" above wound 05 directly on skin.



TWIST the windlass rod until 08 bleeding has stopped (complete steps 1-8 in under 1 min).



SECURE with the windlass 11 safety strap.



PULL self-adhering band 06 TIGHTLY, removing all slack.



LOCK the windlass rod in place 09 with the windlass clip.





ROUTE self-adhering band around 10 the rod and between the clips.

STEP 9 NOTE: If bleeding is not controlled and/or a distal pulse is present, continue to twist the windlass rod or apply a second tourniquet above the original tourniquet



ANNOTATE time of tourniquet 12 application on the strap (or the casualty's forehead) completing the process within 3 mins.



DOCUMENT all findings and 13 treatments on the DD Form 1380 TCCC Casualty Card and attach it to the casualty.
