













## TWO-HANDED (RATCHET) TOURNIQUET APPLICATION

## TACTICAL FIELD CARE (TFC)



**CONSIDER** body substance isolation. **NOTE**: If a Combat Lifesaver is available, direct them to assist. **NOTE:** Reassess any tourniquet applied in Care Under Fire and, if ineffective, tighten (if possible) and apply a second tourniquet side-by-side with the first if bleeding is not controlled.

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**EXPOSE** the injury and assess the bleeding source. **NOTE:** Clothing may need to be cut away to properly expose the injury.



**APPLY** direct pressure to control bleeding.



**REMOVE** tourniquet from casualty's JFAK and/or carrying pouch.



**1NSERT** wounded extremity in the loop of the tourniquet strap.



**04b ROUTE** band around limb, and through routing buckle. **PULL** back on itself.



**POSITION** 2-3" above wound directly on skin.



**PULL** strap as TIGHTLY as possible, removing excess slack **before** tightening the ratchet device.



**RATCHET** device as tightly as possible until bleeding stops (complete steps 1-7 in under 1 min).



**OS** LOCK the ratchet on itself (it will click into place).



**WRAP** excess strap around the ratchet device and **SECURE** in place.

**STEP 8 NOTE:** If bleeding is not controlled, or a distal pulse is present, continue to tighten the ratchet or apply a second tourniquet above the original tourniquet.



application on the strap (or the casualty's forehead) completing the process within 3 minutes.



**DOCUMENT** all findings and treatments on the DD Form 1380 TCCC Casualty Card and attach it to the casualty.
